The agenda was dealt with in the following order.

1. Apologies Ngā Whakapāha

Apologies were received from James Gough, Sam MacDonald and Bridget Williams.

2. Memorial Avenue, Notice of Motion, Investigation into the viability of clearway/s

Council Transport staff presented to the Board on an investigation into the viability of a clear on Memorial Avenue. During the discussion, the following points were raised:

- Improving traffic flow will require efforts to improve to efficiency of the main intersections along the route. Some of the intersections are already operating at close to their full capacity.
- A clearway between the intersections would likely have minimal impact without corresponding intersection improvements to increase capacity.
- Memorial Ave would likely need modifications to safely accommodate two lanes of traffic in each direction and still allow space for cyclists.
- Board members discussed the possibility of focusing only on the westbound route and running a trial over short sections of the route to test the viability.
