## Mayor's Report to Elected Members – January 2019

### Foreword

January represented a good opportunity for us to take stock of last year, and refocus our goals for the city moving into 2019. As the city began refilling after the break, it was pleasing to see people making the most of the good weather and events on offer throughout the central city.

I have decided to add Cr Anne Galloway to the Innovation and Sustainable Development Committee, and am seeking the meeting's confirmation.

### **Bread and Circus World Buskers Festival**



This year's festival, with a bigger and bolder programme of events than previous years, was delivered by Strut & Fret. A host of world-class performances set across

paid, free and roving venues allowed for the festival to run for a whole month. LIMBO was the headline act, and the fantastic show packed out the Speigeltent by the Avon River with a mix of cabaret, circus and acrobatics.

### **Duvauchelle & Little River A&P Shows**

The Duvauchelle & Little River A&P bring town and country together every year. 2019 was the Duvauchelle A&P show's 150th anniversary. Little River A&P Show, on the other



hand, has been going for 107 years Speaking at both , acknowledged the mportant roles of bast and present officials and volunteers, who work tirelessly to make these davs

happen. I was thrilled to meet the winner of the Terrier Race with Community Board Chair, Pam Richardson. And the Community Award winner at Little River, Sheryl Stanbury who was awarded a Royal Agricultural Society medal for her services to the Little River A&P show and the community.

### **Christchurch Business Club**

I was invited to speak at the first Christchurch Business Club meeting of 2019, to update members on how the Council family is looking to better harness new and existing opportunities across the city. I took the opportunity to identify a few of the unique opportunities and challenges we think the city is facing, and outline some initiatives that we have put in place as a result. I also highlight a number of upcoming key milestones for the city.

### **Chinese New Year Reception**

This event was hosted by the Chinese Consul General to usher in the Year of the Pig. This event is always an important one on the calendar and it was pleasing to see a number of Mayors across the wider region in

attendance, as well as some of my fellow Council colleagues and MPs. Their attendance was representative of the ongoing commitment to growing the relationship between China and our city and region.



Louisson Place, Opawa, is the Otautahi Community Housing Trust's first social housing

development since taking over the social housing portfolio from the Council in 2016. This recently completed 8unit development will house families in need.



### Ka Huru Manu Exhibition



This Exhibition is a project dedicated to creating a Ngai Tahu atlas of place names and histories through cultural mapping - an international world first. This exhibition was made all the

more special by being held in Tūranga, the result of a curation and installation partnership between the Council and Ngai Tahu.

### Official Opening of Manawa and Christchurch Outpatients Buildings

This event represented a double celebration of two new buildings within the city's Health Precinct. Manawa houses a new health research and education collaboration between Ara Institute of Canterbury, Canterbury DHB and the University of Canterbury. The new outpatients facility brings together 27 services over five floors of the new building. It was pleasing to mark further progress across the city's hospital facilities, attending alongside Cllr Keown in his capacity as a CDHB Board member.
