













































Friends of Abberley Park







Dear Community Board Members,

Re: Community Board Request - Possible installation of "No stopping lines"

We have met and spoken on-site with Mr Steve DeJong Traffic Engineer for City Transport Services re the possible installation of "no stopping lines" outside our driveway at 311 Wooldridge Road Harewood.

The reason for our request is an issue we experience when trying to exit our property safely throughout the Rugby and Touch Rugby seasons at Nunweek Park opposite our property.

On these many occasions parking becomes intensive on both sides of Wooldridge Road causing vehicles to park right up to our gateway on Wooldridge Road and blocking any view of approaching traffic from the south. Park users cannot park right off the road because of a drainage swale along front of our property and therefore are parking mostly outside the road edge white line.

Another factor is the yellow centre line markings which runs more than 5 metres south of our driveway.

Trying to edge front of our vehicle onto this restricted yellow centre lined road is a little akin to Russian Roulette and a recipe for a serious incident and if this were to happened we would be completely in the wrong.

The traffic changes removing the Wairakei Road /Russley Road Roundabout has obviously caused a significant increase in Wooldridge Road through traffic as well.

Our suggested length of "No stopping lines" south from our driveway is at least three vehicle lengths which would then enable a much clearer view of traffic approaching from our right and making exiting our driveway a much safer operation.

We would appreciate Community Board Members giving our request serious consideration for "No stopping lines" along road edge south from our property at 311 Wooldridge Road gateway.
