Prior to the 2010 & 2011 earthquakes we had problems with quite a few unruly drivers speeding along Edgeware Road between Hills Road and Barbadoes St. This is a relatively long and wide stretch of road which seems to encourage the behaviour. The earthquakes did seem to minimise the problem for a few years however the speedsters have returned. The number of drivers excessively speeding along this patch of road has increased noticeably over the past couple of months, possibly exacerbated by roadworks in the area which have changed driving patterns. The speeds we are experiencing are definitely dangerous and a concern to all residents.

Any assistance the council can provide to discourage this behaviour would be appreciated.

Hello again,

What is the progress on the issue of vehicles speeding on residential street to avoid traffic lights and road works in the St Albans area? We are still noticing huge increases in vehicle traffic on our residential roads and non-adherence to the 40km/hr residential zones. I understand the Westminster / Cranford intersection is due to half re-open next week. How you will be managing this new safety risk for the large number of parents who wait outside this gate for their children to finish up school?

When do we expect to see traffic calming measures begin on our residential streets? This is a very real safety issue for the children of St Albans and one that CCC can no longer ignore. We need immediate action and can not wait until the new year for consultation. Traffic management and enforcement measures need to be implemented immediately,
