Innovating Streets for People - Pilot Fund


- Announced by Waka Kotahi 3 Apr 2020
- Ferry Road Cycle Connection application submitted on 8 May 2020 for funding in Round 1
- Successful applications announced 22 June 2020
- 90% funding assistance from Waka Kotahi, 10% funded by Council (total budget \$396,520)
- Aim to use tactical urbanism approaches to trial low-cost, temporary initiatives to make our streets safer and more liveable



Oct – Dec 2020 Monitor and modify design as required

• 2021 Decommission and share learnings with Waka Kotahi Community of Practice, Linwood-Central-



Hi Michelle,

I have been talking to Gerard Friel from CCC who has suggested that I contact you asking for your assistance with a request I have.

I am the sister of the late Kelven Scott - the blind busker who passed away in January this year.

I was wanting you to point me in the right direction as to who I would ask/get permission from to have a small plaque in his memory placed in the square at the place he last busked. This is the garden directly opposite the toilets - there is concrete surrounding the tree plot that it could be attached to - I have seen something similar in the square for other people. Kelven spent many years busking in the square and when he was able to go back in after the earthquakes this is where he chose to play.

He was a well known and loved fixture in the square and I would love it if we could have something in his memory.

I live in Southland so really have no idea who to approach about this and would appreciate it if you could help me out.
