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

Note: to assist with confusion we refer to -

Cameo Grove East - existing Cameo Grove (road)
Cameo Grove West - new Cameo Grove (road) within Prestons Park
Cameo Grove - Cameo Grove subdivision

Many thanks for allowing us to present this petition

- Consenting process for Prestons Park Subdivision did not allow for submissions from the existing residents of Cameo Grove (East & Subdivision). This seems unfair.
- · Uncertainty of extension design Thanks to Mike Calvert (CCC) for clarification
- Cameo Grove Subdivision History
- Traffic using route as a short cut with associated problems volume, speed, throughway
- Exacerbated by joining of Katrine Drive to Cameo Grove West, safety is of concern as there are constant speeding issue currently being experience by residents
- Existing difficulties of turning onto Burwood road in particular right turns (in and out) Again
 concerns with volume, speed & throughway. Between Holland Park Entrance and The Limes
 there is no foot paths or cycleways for school age children and others.
- · Safety of many walkers (regardless of age & stage), dogs, runners, cyclists
- · Recreational nature of the environment and a SAFE place for all to enjoy including:
 - Walkers, dog walkers, families, residents of Alpine View, runners, cyclists
 - Bird life and eels
 - Currently a place of quiet and tranquility

We the petitioners respectfully request through the Community Board will advocate on our behalf with the Council for:

- The Council to re-consult with CDL Properties to review the resource consent and approve cycle and walkway access to link Cameo Groves East and West.
- 2. The Council not to open up Katrine Drive onto Cameo Grove West -

Both suggestions will make our communities safer and more relaxed, in particular for our children and grandchildren.
