

Good Afternoon.

I am here on behalf of the Greater Hornby Resident's Association.

I have here 2 applications for Faye to look over on behalf of our association and the Community Board.

- 1. An application for a grant of \$1945.00 for a memorial stone with the accompanying bronze plaque as inscribed. This memorial stone would be installed on the right hand side of the path near the toilets on the same side as McDonalds. The location was discussed with David Pritchard from the C.C.C. Parks and Reserves team. It is planned that this would be installed by a working bee from the G.H.R.A. with approval from Council, to keep costs down.
- 2. An application for funding for the upgrade of the Denton Park sign and including the 10th British Commonwealth Games Symbal. This has involved discussions with both the Minister of Internal Affairs and the Olympic Committee, so has taken some time. The choice chosen by the G.H.R.A. is 1c at a price of \$6,467.81 +GST. The reason this choice was chosen is that the current sign is in the advanced stage of deterioration. The G.H.R.A. believes that the renewal and upgrade as put forward



would be beneficial to the community and the city at large as a memorial of the games with the last 2 buildings from the games being located on Denton Park. By including the sign renewal in this grant it would mean that the financial cost could fall within this grant instead of a Parks and Reserves budget moving forward.

We are also investigating the installation of a sign post for the Suffragette's memorial which is also on Denton Park. Hornby was one of the main areas involved in the movement and deserves a signpost.
