1. Brief Summary

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide the Road Closure Subcommittee with information to enable the Subcommittee to make a decision regarding the application for proposed road closures for the Sea to Sky 2021. The report has been written because the Canterbury Triathlon Club have proposed to close sections of Summit Road and Mount Pleasant Road, for the Sea to Sky Triathlon 2021.
- 1.2 Public notification was carried out through publication notification in The Press and on the Council website. The period of time allowing for objections to be received met the minimum time period of one week. The application was publicly advertised on Monday 15 February 2021 with objections closing 9am Tuesday 23 February 2021.
- 1.3 At the time of writing this report, no objections have been received from the public notification.
- 1.4 This event has operated in these locations previously with no known issues.
- 1.5 The event organisers has undertaken notifications to make sure impacted stakeholders are aware of the proposed road closures.
- 1.6 The event organisers are required to undertake direct notification to impacted parties as part of the road closure application process. At the time of writing this report, the event organiser has indicated that they will be providing a record of any feedback received, from impacted parties, to the Subcommittee. 

1. Brief Summary

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is provide the Road Closure Subcommittee with information to enable the Subcommittee to make a decision regarding the application for proposed road closures for the City to Surf Running Event 2021. The report has been written as an application has been received to close multiple roads to enable the City to Surf event to be held for 2021.
- 1.2 Public notification was carried out through placement of a public notice in The Press and on the council website. The period of time allowing for objections to be received met the minimum time period of one week. The application was publicly advertised on Thursday 28 January 2021 with objections closing on Friday 5 February 2021.
- 1.3 No objections were received from the public notification.
- 1.4 The event organisers are required to undertake direct notifications to impacted parties as part of the road closure application process. At the time of writing this report, the event organiser has indicated that they will be providing a record of any feedback received, from impacted parties, to the Subcommittee. This information will be provided in advance of the scheduled meeting or alternatively they may present the information in person to the Subcommittee.
- 1.5 This event has operated in these locations previously with no known issues.
- 1.6 Although the application proposes to close the roads along the entire route from 7am to 6pm on Sunday 21 March 2021, there will be a progressive reopening of roads when it is safe to do so after participants have passed.
- 1.7 The event participants crossing adjoining side roads is intended to be managed via Manual Traffic Control (Stop / Go) and is therefore not required to be applied for as road closures. Traffic Management staff intend to hold traffic for the first initial wave of runners to pass and then participants will be managed by marshals and traffic controllers to ensure that traffic is not unreasonably impacted.
- 1.8 Staff support the proposed closures and believe that they will not unreasonably impact traffic.

2. Officer Recommendations / Ngā Tūtohu

- 1. Receive the information in the report.
- 2. Authorise the approval to close the following roads from 7am to 6pm Sunday 21 March 2021, noting a progressive opening will occur when it is safe to do so, after participants have passed:
 - a. Rose Street Between Hoon Hay Road and Beechworth Avenue
 - b. Lyttelton Street Between Stanbury Avenue and Rose Street
 - c. Cashmere View Street- Between Rose Street and Ashgrove Terrace

- d. Ashgrove Terrace Between Cashmere View Street and Colombo Street
- e. Waimea Terrace Between Colombo Street and Birdwood Avenue
- f. Eastern Terrace Between Birdwood Avenue and Waltham Road
- g. Fifield Terrace Between Waltham Road and 32m south of the southern boundary of 271 Fifield Terrace
- h. Aynsley Terrace Between Garlands Road and 77 Aynsley Terrace
- i. Grange Street Between Aynsley Terrace and SH73 Opawa Road
- j. Port Hills Road At the intersection of SH73 Opawa Road
- k. Martindales Road Between Port Hills Road and Truscotts Road
- I. Truscotts Road Between Martindales Road and Ferrymead Park Drive
- m. Ferrymead Park Drive -Between Truscotts Road and Bridle Path Road.

1. Brief Summary

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide the Road Closure Subcommittee with information to enable the Road Closure Subcommittee to make a decision regarding the application for proposed road closures for the Pier to Pier Running Event. The report has been written because the New Brighton Olympic Athletic Club have proposed to close sections of Marine Parade, Seaview Road and Brighton Mall for the Pier to Pier Running Event 2021.
- 1.2 Public notification was carried out through publication notification in The Press and on the Council website. The period of time allowing for objections to be received met the minimum time period of one week. The application was publicly advertised on Monday 15 February 2021 with objections closing 9am Tuesday 23 February 2021.

1. Brief Summary

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to provide the Road Closure Subcommittee with information to enable the Subcommittee to make a decision regarding the application for proposed road closures for the Lincoln University Graduation Parades. The report has been written because Lincoln University have proposed to close a section of Worcester Boulevard, for their graduation parades.
- 1.2 Public notification was carried out through publication notification in The Press and on the Council website. The period of time allowing for objections to be received met the minimum time period of one week. The application was publicly advertised on Monday 28 January 2021 with objections closing 9am Friday 5 February 2021.
- 1.3 No objections were received from the public notification.
- 1.4 The event organisers are required to undertake notifications to make sure impacted stakeholders are aware of the proposed road closures.
- 1.5 At the time of writing this report, the event organiser has indicated that they will be providing a record of any feedback received, from impacted parties, to the Subcommittee. This information will be provided in advance of the scheduled meeting or alternatively they may present the information in person to the Subcommittee.
- 1.6 This event has a shorter closure length than previous years, proposing to close Worcester Boulevard between Montreal Street and Cambridge Terrace only, this removes the need for the parade to cross Montreal Street. The signalised crossing points at both Cambridge Terrace/Worcester Boulevard intersection and the Armagh Street/Oxford Terrace intersection are intended to be modified by the Council Real Time Operations Team to allow a longer pedestrian phases to help the parade cross in large groups.
- 1.7 Staff support the proposed closure and believe the proposed closures will not unreasonably impact traffic.

2. Officer Recommendations / Ngā Tūtohu

- 1. Receive the information in the report.
- 2. Authorise the approval to close Worcester Boulevard, from Montreal Street to Cambridge Terrace from 9.20am to 9.50am and from 1.20pm to 1.50pm on Thursday 13 and Friday 14 May 2021 for the Lincoln University Graduation Parades.
