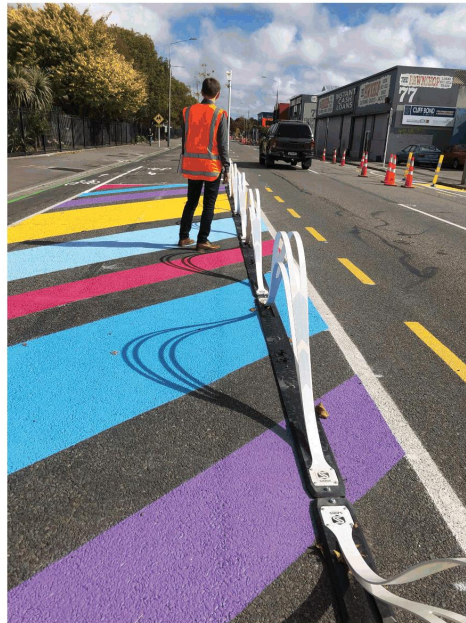

## Social Enterprise for local community



*Nourish Ōraka is a new social enterprise established specifically to respond to the opportunity of supplying school lunches in Ōraka/Shirley.*

OUR PURPOSE:

- To provide training and employment opportunities in the Ōraka/Shirley community.
- To provide healthy kai that utilises seasonal, local produce and showcases the ethnic diversity in our community.
- To build and strengthen connections between people living within the community.
- To work towards environmental sustainability.



With support from the Shirley Village Project, two local residents set up Nourish Ōraka Limited in response to the government's free healthy lunch school programme. Under the constitution of this social enterprise, any profits generated will be used to further community development.

The enterprise demonstrates the modelling of sustainable practices to the school children by keeping things local, delivering by bicycle trailer, having reusable lunchboxes and composting waste at community gardens.

In the long term we'd love to see produce grown locally for the school lunches.

- Valley Road – a resident asked for improved access to a walking track off Valley Road.
- Traffic Safety – a resident asked for improved traffic safety near schools.

### Community Board Decision Under Delegation:

- Community Board approved a grant of \$1,500 from its DRF to Pioneer Basketball Club towards the Pioneer Boomers project.

## Community Board Meeting on 4 May 2021

### Public Forum Presentation:

- Purau Reserve – A resident asked for wilding trees to be removed to promote native regeneration in Purau Reserve.

### Correspondence:

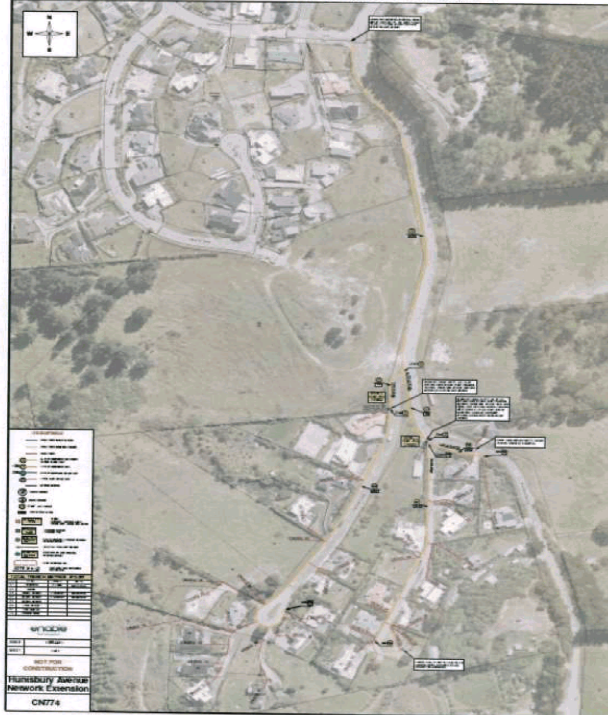
- Fibre Connection – residents spoke and wrote about a lack of fibre connection in the Huntsbury neighbourhood.

## Community Board Decisions Under Delegation

- Approved installation of eight new lighting poles on Thomson Park.
- Appointed Phil Mauger as Board Liaison to the All Saints Anglican Church.
- Approval of on street parking near All Saints Church – New Brighton Road
- Allocations of funding from the Waitai/Coastal-Burwood Community Board’s 2020-21 Discretionary Response Fund to:
  - Burwood Park Tennis Club – for resurfacing costs of the third court.
  - Crossroads Youth With A Future – for carving shed improvements.
  - New Brighton Community Gardens Trust – for mentoring and equipment.
- The Board received a petition with 37 signatories regarding safety concerns in the Avondale Community. The Board referred the issues raised to staff for investigation and requested a report back.

- Approval of No stopping restrictions on Owles Terrace.
- Approval of 10 minutes time restricted parking on Union Street.
- Allocations of funding from the Waitai/Coastal-Burwood Community Board's 2020-21 Discretionary Response Fund to go towards the reinstatement of the ANZAC Fronds and approval of the concept design.

## ANZAC Day Services 2021

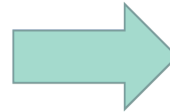
- Members from the Board attended the following ANZAC Day Services in the Coastal-Burwood wards:

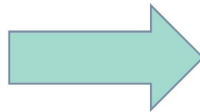
## RedZone 6 Event

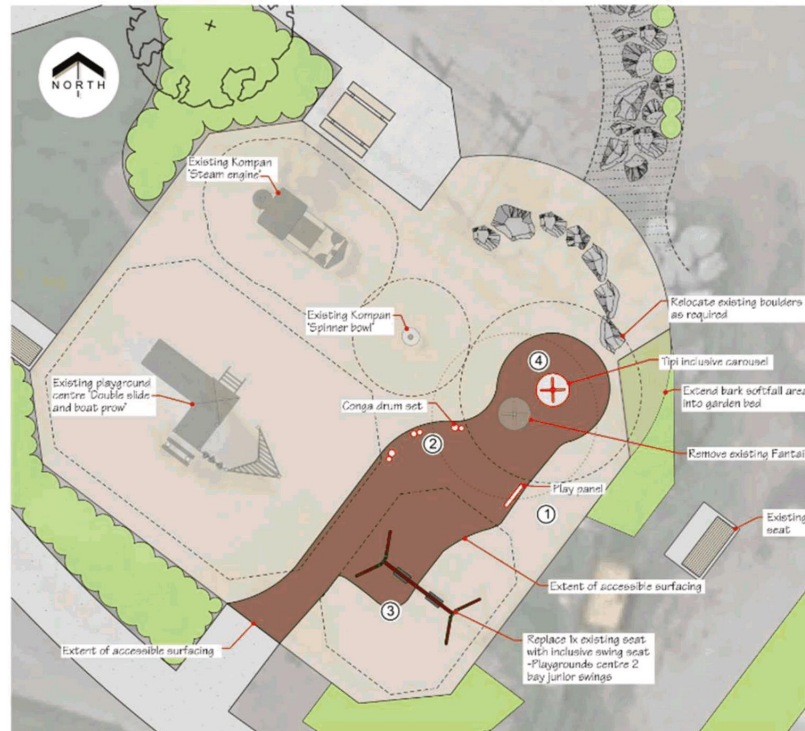
