

We pose the following questions to the Community Board

1. If the Council continue their stance that only the leaves that fall from the trees are their responsibility to manage, and not the birds or anything that falls from them, then who is accountable for the problems caused by the birds?
2. Notwithstanding acceptance of accountability or responsibility of management of the birds, there is a substance on Council land that damages property, emits a foul smell, is nauseating and can be known to harbour disease, has an assessment of a public health hazard been undertaken?
3. Does a hazard management plan exist that addresses both health and physical risks posed by the trees and related factors including property damage?
4. Does a long term tree management plan exist for the Dudley St street trees given a previously advised healthy life expectancy of 10 years?
5. What are the next steps and when will they be actioned?

As an almost daily user (for therapy) of the G. Condon pool, I am very much aware of what occurs there.

Protocols, processes and training of staff, to actually and actively carry out their duties, needs attention.

Please see below.

I did take two photos upon leaving, [redacted] requested my not using that of [redacted], but confirmed it was [redacted] that had been on duty as Supervisor and yet had NOT been aware, as had been talking the entire 25 minutes to another Lifeguard, that is, he had not been walking around the pool, had not directed the other Lifeguards to pay attention to high use areas, with over 20 children in, the Leisure land and the Teaching pool area.
