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

- The Greater Christchurch Spatial Plan builds on a strong base of past work.











Spatial Plan Development process

- ❖ The blueprint for an urban form that accommodates a population potentially doubling to 1 million people.
- **❖**Overall Directions:
 - ❖ Targeted intensification in urban and town centres and along public transport corridors
 - The prosperous development of kāinga nohoanga






Huihui Mai pre-engagement to inform the Draft Plan

Of the more than 7,000 people who responded to the online survey:






are open to higher density living, but it needs to be planned and designed to meet their different needs and provide quality of life for people.

- ❖ 358 submissions received.
- An Officers' Report was prepared to consider submissions and make recommendations to the Hearing Panel.
- ❖ Heard 86 submitters over six days across the three Districts.










Hearings Summary

- ❖ The Panel supports the overall direction of the draft Greater Christchurch Spatial Plan and has made some recommendations.






Youth Engagement


