Styx Living Laboratory Trust Field Trip

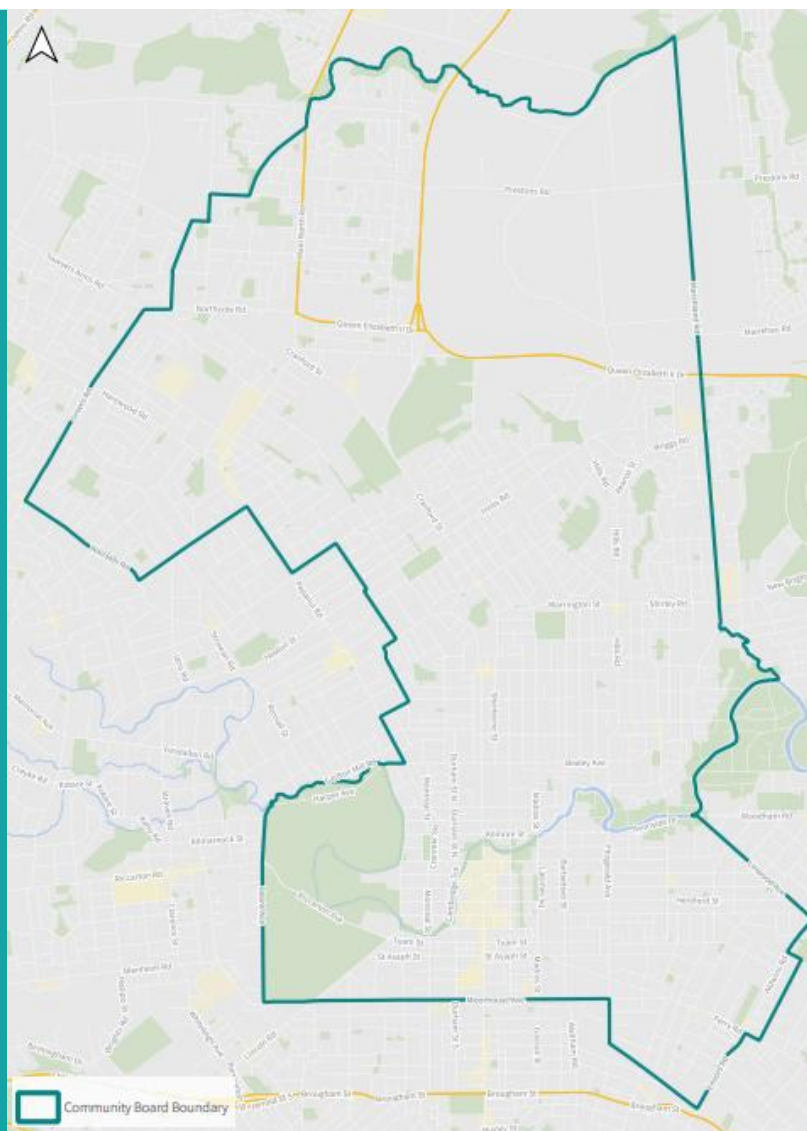

Quiz Night Fundraiser for a new Halswell Community Patrol

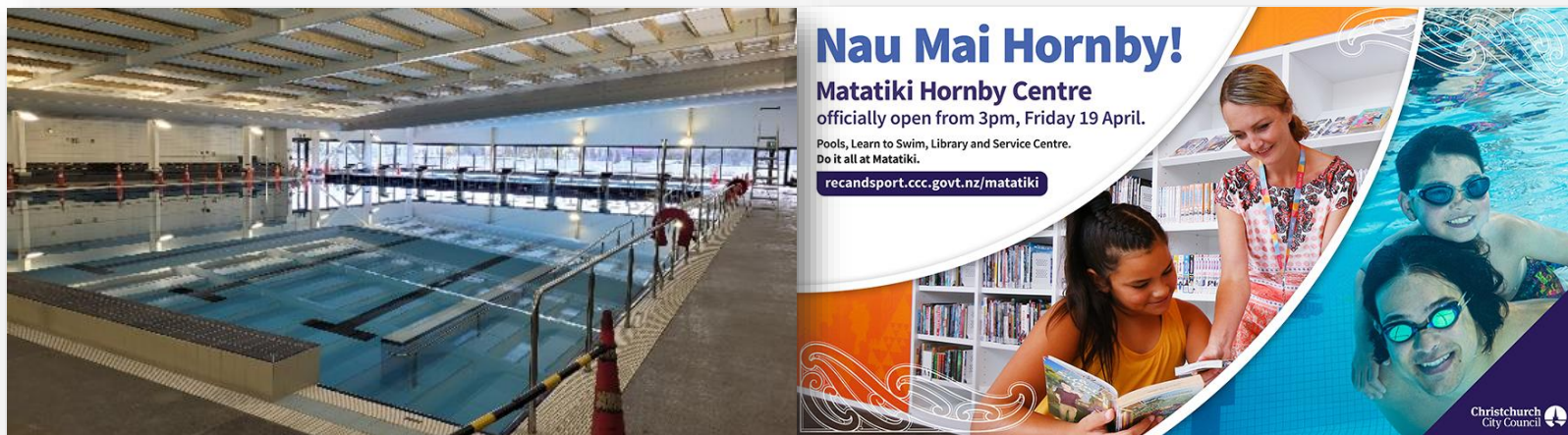


A Quiz Night to fundraise for a new Halswell Community Patrol was held at Craythornes Hotel on Monday 26 February.

- SWZC Action Plan Budget funded project
- Tauira/students learn about native biodiversity, care for a local restoration site, and learn about mahinga kai
- Planted 400 seedlings along the Huritini/Halswell awa at Te Motu Huritini o Ahuriri site
- Riparian planting helps:
 - Stabilise the riverbank, filters run-off from land and helps improve water quality
 - Provides cooling shade and habitat for fish and invertebrates in the awa
 - Provides habitat for native bird, invertebrate and lizard species on the river bank
 - Sequesters carbon and provides oxygen
