Report for the Board to consider appropriate planting for the berms adjacent to Linfield park to discourage inappropriate planting

1. Purpose of this Memo

- 1.1 At its meeting on 13 July 2022, the Waikura Linwood-Central-Heathcote Community Board Resolved LCHB/2022/00086 (report item 12, point 5), "Requests a Report for the Board to consider appropriate planting for the berms adjacent to Linfield Park to discourage inappropriate parking".

2. Update

- 2.1 Kerb side grass berm assets originally not intended to be gardens would need to be prepared (dug out) to the appropriate depth and comply with the Christchurch City Council IDS (Infrastructure Design Standard) and CSS (Construction Standard Specifications) standards to sustain shrubs, and in a way that the full and safe use of legal road was not compromised.
- 2.2 A project of this scale would involve a significant budget that is beyond what we currently have for this type of work.
- 2.3 If this is a priority for the Community Board, we suggest promoting this as a Long Term Plan (LTP) project.

3. Conclusion

- 3.1 We currently do not have funding to implement this type of project at this location. However, we would happily advise the Community Board on the costs and information that would better help promoting this as an LTP project.
