#### 3.2 **Community Funding Summary**

## 3.2.3 Youth Development Fund

Board members with the delegation for the Waitai Coastal-Burwood-Linwood Community Board Youth Development Fund (Jo Zervos, Paul McMahon and Greg Mitchell) made four decisions under delegation:

- A grant of \$150 from the 2023/24 Waitai Coastal-Burwood-Linwood Youth Development Fund to Bethany Andrew towards costs of competing in the NZCAF Aerobics National Competition in Wellington from the 15 to 17 September 2023.
- A grant of \$200 from the 2023/24 Waitai Coastal-Burwood-Linwood Youth
  Development Fund to Brooklyn Schreiner towards costs of attending the Scout
  Jamboree in Hamilton from 30 December 2023 to 07 January 2024.
- A grant of \$200 from the 2023-24 Waitai Coastal-Burwood-Linwood Youth
  Development Fund to Bowen Abraham towards costs of attending the Oceania
  Championships in Hastings from 06 to 10 December 2023.
- A grant of \$200 from the 2023-24 Waitai Coastal-Burwood-Linwood Youth
  Development Fund to Arnika-Rose Gread-Robinson towards costs of attending
  the 16th Grade Girls South Island Tournament in Dunedin from 02 to 04 October
  2023.



#### 3.2.4 Fresh pool Party

Youth and Cultural Development were back at Te Pou Toetoe for their FRESH Pool Party on Friday night, 18 August 2023. With their trademark free food and drinks, free fades and braids and live DJ, FRESH is part of a series of Youth Events they run across the city. Through a contribution from the Waste Waster Treatment Plant Funding, YCD were able to up the number of Pool Parties they could deliver at Te Pou Toetoe, turning it into a regular event to increase and maintain youth participation in the Linwood area.



## 3.2.5 Aquatic Innovation Award

The Fresh Pool Party events were recognised for their innovation at the Recreation Aotearoa NZ Aquatic Awards at the Waves Conference mid-September. The Recreation, Sport and Events Unit received the Aquatic Innovation Award in collaboration with Youth and Cultural Development and Sport Canterbury for the FRESH Pool Parties, which have revolutionised the recreational pool party for youth and their whānau in the Linwood community. These events have received funding support from the Waitai Community Board and through the Waste Water Fire Fund.



#### 3.2.6 Pages Road Chorus Cabinet

Led by the Council Graffiti Team this project sees local artists commissioned to paint their designs on Chorus telecommunications cabinets. Former solider Chris Solly had his ANZAC tribute design painted on the Chorus cabinet near the Christchurch Memorial RSA social housing. Chris' design, which features a scene from the Battle of The Somme, was chosen through the Chorus cabinet art initiative. 10 winning designs were chosen from 54 entries.




## 3.3 Participation in and Contribution to Decision Making

#### Community Board Plan

#### Shared Reading at Linwood Library

Te Kete Wānanga o Ihutai have initiated a Shared Reading Kaihapai, every Monday from 10.30 – 11.30am at the Library at Eastgate Mall. The first session was held on 18 September 2023. The group is aimed at giving community opportunities to discover new ways to read and engage with literature in an interactive way. The sessions are free to attend and no bookings are required, so community are free to drop by, listen to a story or poem as a group, break it down and have a kōrero about how it made them feel, how they interpreted it and what thoughts it provoked.



#### **Fruit Trees for Community Gardens**

Canterbury Community Gardens Association have arranged for 250 fruit trees to be donated to over 40 māra kai across Ōtautahi. Grown at Waimea Nurseries, Smith Street Gardens then served as a depot for the project, hosting and caring for the trees until they could be picked up and delivered to sites across the city. As a result, Smith Street Gardens ended up being the perfect spot for gardeners from several different māra kai to meet and connect with each other.

In a joined-up effort to get the trees into the ground on 19 September 2023, staff and volunteers from Smith Street Gardens, New Brighton Community Gardens,




Phillipstown Hub and Linwood Community Garden teamed up to get the trees planted at each site. The fruits the trees produce will supplement the kai offered at community pantries based at Te Whare Taonga o Ngā Iwi Katoa (Linwood Resource Centre) and Phillipstown Hub to help support kai resilience in those areas.



## **Community Board Briefing in the Community**

The Community Board held their third Briefing in the community at the Bromley Community Centre on Thursday 24 August 2023. The Board received presentations from a number of local Linwood Groups including Kawai Rangatahi and the Bromley Community Centre.





## Event Report Back

#### 2023 Global Basketball Festival

Held on 9-10 September 2023 at Cowles Stadium this event is organised by the Philippines Culture and Migrant Services with support from the Christchurch City Council.

## **Shabby Chic Market Day**

Held at the historic Rochester Villa on Connal Street in Woolston on Saturday 3 September 2023, the Shabby Chic market is Christchurch's longest running vintage market. With over 40 stalls of vintage items, linens, costumes, jewellery, collectables, retro, kitsh and kitchen antiques, craftworks, furniture and lots more. The market attracted over 100 people browsing the stalls and enjoying the free entertainment.







#### **Linwood Park Outdoor Movie**

A collaboration between Kawai Rangatahi and YCD saw a free family Outdoor Movie screening of Jumanji Welcome to the Jungle on the courts at Te Pou Toetoe on Friday 15 September 2023. There was a great turn out with many families bringing chairs and blankets to enjoy the film and the free food and drinks that were provided by the organisers.





### Waimairi Beach Residents Association Clean Up event

Local residents of Waimairi Beach collected over 6 bags of rubbish from the parks in their area during the Keep NZ Beautiful Week event on 16 September 2023. The Residents Association are planning a number of other local events for summer as well as hosting regular Coffee Group catch ups at the Brighton Beach House for residents to connect with each other.

#### Upcoming Events

#### **Pasifika Matua Olympics**

Saturday 30 September 2023 from 9.30am to 1pm at Haeata Campus, this is a new event which is organised in collaboration with a number of organisations and groups including Christchurch City Council.





#### **The Loft Housing Event**

The Loft are hosting a Housing support for the community event on Monday 9 October 2023 from 10am to 2pm. The event is for people who are struggling to find housing, living in an unhealthy home, supporting clients with these needs or need items for your home. People can talk to MSD housing specialists, Kāinga Ora, Te Whatu Ora, Anglican Advocacy, Ireland Property Managers, Link People and Comcare.

#### **Spring Fair**

Saturday 21 October from 10am to 2pm at Richmond Community Garden, the event is a collaboration between Richmond Community Garden, We are Richmond and Avebury House. It will include the Avebury Vintage Market, a Heritage exhibition, car boot, buskers young and old, local vendors, Repair Revolution, bric-a-brac, mud kitchen, games and plenty of activities.

#### **Fresh Golf Takeover**

This event will be held on Tuesday 3 October 2023 at Ferrymead Golf. The group received some Discretionary Respond Funding support for this event from the Waitai and Waihoro Community Boards.



#### Pae Ora Whānau Fun Run

From 10am to 3pm on Saturday 14 October 2023, at Bottle Lake Forest, there is a 5km or 10km run option. This event was held at the same time last year and was very successful. The event is organised by He Waka Tapu.



#### **Christchurch Heritage Festival**

Runs from the 6 October – 23 October 2023, the theme of the festival is 'Our stories of living and learning'. There are a number of events in the ward area including Radicals guided bicycle ride Radicals guided bicycle ride: Christchurch City Council (ccc.govt.nz) and there are also several Spirited Cemetery tours in the ward – for the full programme and event details refer to What's On: Christchurch City Council (ccc.govt.nz)

#### **Play Week Aotearoa**
